#### **ACCESS AGREEMENT**

Agency: Anderson-Cottonwood Irrigation

Project: ACID Pilot Thiamine Deficiency Project

This Access Agreement is made and entered into as of May 1, 2023 between the Anderson-Cottonwood Irrigation District, an irrigation district formed and existing under Division 11 of the California Water Code ("District") and the State of California, acting by and through the California Department of Fish and Wildlife ("State" or "CDFW").

#### **RECITALS**

- A The District owns, operates, and maintains a diversion dam, fish ladders, and real property in the vicinity of the Sacramento River ("Property"), in the County of Shasta, State of California; and
- B. State, along with other third party cooperators ("Cooperators"), has applied to District for permission to access the Property for purposes of carrying out a pilot project to trap and treat winter-run salmonids for thiamine deficiency under Incidental Take Permit18181-4R, issued to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, under the authority of Section 10(a)(1)(A) of the Endangered Species Act (ITP) (the "Project").
- C. The District desires to accommodate the State's and each Cooperator's application for permission to enter the Property for purposes of the Project, as described in the planning/engineering documents for the Project which are attached hereto as <a href="Exhibit B">Exhibit B</a> (the "Operations Plan")].

#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

This Permit is made upon and subject to the following terms and conditions:

- Project Description: By this Access Agreement, and on a non-exclusive basis, District gives permission to State to enter upon those lands legally described and depicted on the attached <u>Exhibit</u> 6 (the "Property") solely for the purpose of the Project, the limits of which are shown on Exhibit A
- 2. Access Agreement Subject to Laws and Permits: State shall, at State's sole cost and expense, comply with the requirements and mitigations identified by the Environmental Document, including the ITP or other permits governing the Project, and all municipal, state, and federal authorities now in force or which may hereafter be in force pertaining to the Project and use of the Property as provided by this Permit. This Permit is expressly made subject to any and all applicable laws, statutes, codes, regulations, ordinances, orders, requirements, and regulatory permits or approvals, including any conditions of such permits and approvals issued or required to be issued by such regulatory agencies for or in connection with the Project. All such conditions shall be subject to the prior written approval of District.

Prior to entering or commencing any work on the Property, State shall obtain all such legally required permits or approvals and submit to the District full and complete copies of the same, including documentation related to or referenced in such permits and approvals, along with the corresponding

- agency contact and telephone numbers, and related California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") and/or National Environmental Policy Act documentation, if applicable.
- 3. Term of Access Agreement: This Access Agreement begin on May 1, 2023 and end on October 31, 2023 unless revoked or terminated according to its terms or extended by written mutual agreement.
- **4. Consideration:** District and State agree and stipulate that good, valuable and sufficient consideration has been provided by State to District for this Access Agreement.
- **5.** Access Agreement Subject to Existing Claims: This Access Agreement is subject to existing contracts, permits, leases, licenses, encumbrances, and claims, as well as all matters of record which may affect the Property.
- 6. Waiver of Claims and Indemnity: This Access Agreement is made on the express condition that the District is to be free from any and all liability by reason of injury or death to persons or loss or damage to property, from whatever cause, arising out of the use by State, its directors, officers, or employees ("State's Parties") of the Property or any part of it. State, on behalf of itself and each of State's Parties, waives all claims against the District, its directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives and contractors, for injury (including death), loss or damage caused by, arising out of, or in any way connected with the exercise of this Permit or the Project. State covenants and agrees to protect, save harmless, indemnify, and defend the District, its directors, officers, employees, agents, representatives and contractors from and against any and all claims, losses, costs, expenses, damages or liability (collectively, "Claims") caused by, arising out of, or in any way connected with the Project, including any CEQA lawsuits against District and Claims under the State of Federal Endangered Species Acts, any failure on the part of State to fulfill its obligations under this Permit, and any exercise by State of the rights granted by this Permit, except Claims resulting solely from the willful or grossly negligent acts of the District. Although subcontracts are not anticipated, State will further cause such indemnification and waiver of claims in favor of the District to be inserted in each contract and agreement that State executes for the provision of equipment, materials or services in connection with the Project.
- 7. Damage to Lands and Property: With regard solely to the actions of the State's Parties, State shall be responsible for any damage to lands of the District or third parties resulting from installation, operation, and maintenance of the Project, including, but not limited to soil erosion, collapse or subsidence and damage resulting from it. State shall promptly repair and restore to its original condition any property of the District or any third party, including, but not limited to, levees, roads, bridges, ditches, pipelines, water developments, utilities, buildings, and fences that may be damaged or destroyed in connection with the Project. The foregoing paragraph 7 excludes the actions of other Cooperator's, who indemnify the District separately.
- 8. Hazardous Materials: Without limiting the obligations of State under Paragraph 6 of this Access Agreement, State hereby releases and agrees to indemnify, defend, protect, and hold harmless the District from and against any and all Claims (as defined in Paragraph 6 above) arising from or connected with any Hazardous Materials (as defined below) present, alleged to be present, released in, from, or about, or otherwise associated with the Project or the Property at any time, except any Hazardous Materials placed, disposed, or released by District. This release and indemnification includes, without limitation, Claims for injury to or death of any person, biological resource, or damage to any property; and the violation or alleged violation of, or other failure to comply with, any Environmental Laws (as defined below). If any action or proceeding is brought against the District by reason of any such Claim, State shall, at the election of and upon written notice from District, defend such action or proceeding by counsel reasonably acceptable to the District or reimburse District for all charges incurred for services of the District's General Counsel in defending the action or proceeding.

The term "Hazardous Materials" includes, without limitation, any substance, material or waste that is: (a) flammable, explosive or radioactive; (b) a petroleum product or petroleum hydrocarbon. including crude oil, or any product, by-product or fraction thereof; or (c) designated, defined. classified or regulated as a hazardous material, hazardous waste, hazardous or toxic substance, pollutant, contaminant or related material under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980, as amended (42 U.S.C. section 9601, et seq.: hereinafter, "CERCLA"); the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (42 U.S.C. section 6901, et seq.; hereinafter "RCRA"); the Toxic Substances Control Act (15 U.S.C. section 2601, et seq.; hereinafter "TSCA"); the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act (49 U.S.C. section 5101, et seq.; hereinafter "HTA"); the Hazardous Waste Control Law (Health & Saf. Code section 25100, et seq.: hereinafter "HCL"); the Carpenter-Presley-Tanner Hazardous Substance Account Act (Health & Saf. Code section 25300, et seq.; hereinafter "HSA"), including the regulations adopted and publications promulgated pursuant to such statutes, or any other applicable Environmental Laws now in effect or enacted after the date of this Permit. The term "Environmental Laws" includes without limitation, CERCLA, RCRA, TSCA, HTA, HCL, HSA, State and Federal Endangered Species Acts and any other federal, state, local or administrative agency statute, code, ordinance, rule, regulation, order or requirement relating to pollution, protection of human health or safety, the environment, or Hazardous Materials.

- 9. Contractors: State shall incorporate the terms, conditions, and requirements of this Access Agreement when contracting out all or any portion of the work permitted hereunder. State shall be responsible for ensuring that all contractors and subcontractors comply with the terms and conditions of this Access Agreement. Failure of any contractor or subcontractor to abide by the terms and conditions of this Access Agreement shall constitute a default by State (see Paragraph 24) allowing District to terminate this Access Agreement and seek all legal remedies.
- 10. Labor Code Requirements; Prevailing Wage: State understands and agrees that work performed on the Property may be subject to California Labor Code requirements, which include prevailing wage provisions. For more details, please refer to the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) website at <a href="http://www.dir.ca.gov">http://www.dir.ca.gov</a>. State shall pay prevailing wage to all persons employed in the performance of any part of the Project if required by law to do so.
- 11. Insurance Requirements: The State is self-insured and can provide a letter from the California Department of General Services as an attestation. Otherwise, as a condition of this Access Agreement, and in connection with its indemnification and waiver of claims for the Project, State will cause its contractors to provide a policy or policies of insurance as follows:
  - a. FIRE AND CASUALTY DAMAGES.

District will not keep improvements (if any) which are constructed or installed by State under the provisions of this Access Agreement insured against fire or casualty, and State shall make no claim of any nature against District by reason of any damage to the business or property of State in the event of damage or destruction by fire or other cause, arising other than from or out of gross negligence or willful misconduct of agents or employees of the District in the course of their employment.

- 12. Reservation of Rights: District reserves the right to use the Property in any manner, provided such use does not unreasonably interfere with State's rights herein. District and State agree that District's diversion of water from the Sacramento River pursuant to the terms of the District's Sacramento River Settlement Contract will not unreasonably interfere with State's rights herein.
- **13. Access Limits and Special Conditions:** Access to the Property and use of roads/trails shall be limited to the route(s) designated by District and as depicted in Exhibit A. District will open locked gates at Property as requested and necessary for State's implementation of the Project.

**14. Notice of Work:** State shall notify the District representative in writing at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of any change in the project schedule or prior to cessation of work.

- 15. Limits of Work: In no event shall this Access Agreement authorize work in excess of, contrary to, or that varies from the terms herein, the State's incidental take permit(s), or the terms and conditions of any other regulatory agency permit. The State shall ensure that a co-investigator as identified in the State's ITP is onsite to directly supervise Project activities at all times. To the extent that the State utilizes personnel that are not CDFW employees to perform functions directly supportive of and necessary to the Project, such personnel will work under the direct and onsite supervision of the State's co-investigator and be fully covered by the terms of the State's ITP. Under no circumstances, whether or not permitted or authorized by any regulatory agency permit or approval, shall work exceed that which is reasonably necessary to carry out the purpose of the Project or extend beyond the Project boundaries as depicted in Exhibit A. The District has issued this Access Agreement in its capacity as the owner of the Property. Nothing in this Access Agreement constitutes regulatory approval of the Project or responsibility for the Project's implementation by the District.
- **16. Right to Halt Work:** The District reserves the right to halt work with or without prior notice to State, in the event the District determines that any provision contained herein is violated, or any other threat to the Property or its resources, impact on the District's water diversions, or the health and safety of any person(s) or the environment or biological resources arises.
- **17. Use Restrictions:** The use of the Property by State and/or State's Parties shall not be restricted, unless limitations are imposed by District in writing provided to State.

Activities on the Property shall be conducted only in a manner consistent with this Access Agreement. State agrees to prohibit any disorderly conduct and/or contraband. Contraband includes, but is not limited to: alcoholic beverages, marijuana, illegal and illicit drugs, firearms, explosives, and weapons.

Use of specified roads and trails (as identified on Exhibit A) by any motorized vehicle (including but not limited to motorcycle, car, truck, jeep, tractor, or all-terrain vehicle) shall be limited to only the State and State's Parties for patrol, maintenance or repair purposes only and shall be subject to all other conditions and/or restrictions of this Access Agreement.

State shall not use or allow the Property to be used, either in whole or in part, for any purpose other than as herein set forth, without the prior written consent of District.

18. District's Right to Enter: At all times during the term of this Access Agreement, there shall be and is hereby expressly reserved to District and to any of its agencies, contractors, agents, employees, representatives or licensees, including other representatives of Sacramento River Settlement Contractors, the right at any and all times, and any and all places, to enter upon said Property to survey, inspect, or perform any other lawful District purposes.

State agrees to not interfere with District's right to enter and use the Property.

- **19. Protection of Property:** State shall protect the Property, including all improvements and the natural resources thereon, at all times at State's sole cost and expense, and State shall strictly adhere to the following restrictions:
  - (a) State may not place or dump garbage, trash or refuse anywhere upon or within the Property, except in self-contained trash receptacles that are maintained to District's satisfaction by State.
  - (b) State may not commit or create, or suffer to be committed or created, any waste, hazardous condition and/or nuisance to occur upon the Property.
  - (c) State may not cut, prune or remove any native trees or brush upon the Property without first obtaining written permission from the District.
  - (d) State may not disturb, move or remove any rocks or boulders upon the Property except for routine fire protection, trail clearing, maintenance or the elimination of safety hazards, without first obtaining written permission from the District.
  - (e) State may not grade or regrade, or alter in any way, the ground surface of the Property, without first obtaining written permission from the District.
  - (g) State shall not generate, use, store, release, or dispose of Hazardous Materials on the Property, or authorize or permit any of the same by any third party.
  - (h) State shall exercise due diligence in the protection of the Property against damage or destruction by fire, vandalism or other cause.
- **20. Default:** In the event of a default or breach by State of any of the terms or conditions set forth in this Access Agreement, District may at any time thereafter, without limiting District in the exercise of any right or remedy at law or in equity which District may have by reason of such default or breach:
  - (a) Maintain this Access Agreement in full force and effect and recover the consideration, if any and other monetary charges as they become due, without terminating State's right to use of the District Property, irrespective of whether State shall have abandoned the Property.
  - (b) Terminate this Access Agreement whereupon State shall immediately vacate and surrender possession of the Property to District. In such event, District shall be entitled to recover from State all damages incurred by District by reason of State's default including, but not limited to, the following:
    - (i) any amount necessary to compensate District for all the detriment proximately caused by State's failure to perform its obligations under this Permit or which in the ordinary course of events would be likely to result therefrom; plus
    - (ii) at District's election, such other amounts in addition to or in lieu of the foregoing as may be permitted from time to time by applicable law. Upon termination of this Access Agreement, District shall have the right to make any reasonable repairs, alterations, restoration, or modifications to the Property, which District, in its sole discretion, deems reasonable and necessary for the District's use of the Property.
  - 21. District's Right to Cure State's Default: At any time, after State is in default or material breach of this Access Agreement, District may, but is not required to, cure such default or breach at State's cost.

**22. Revocation of Access:** District shall have the absolute right to revoke this Access Agreement for any reason upon twenty-four (24) hour written notice to State. Written notice to State may be accomplished by electronic or facsimile transmission, and the notice period set forth in this paragraph shall begin on the date of the written notice. Nothing stated herein shall limit the District's exercise of its legal and equitable remedies. All written notices to State shall be sent to the following address:

- 23. Voluntary Execution and Independence of Counsel: By their respective signatures below each party hereto affirms that they have read and understood this Permit and have received independent counsel and advice from their attorneys with respect to the advisability of executing this Access Agreement.
- **24. Reliance on Investigations:** State accepts this Access Agreement, and the Property to which it pertains, in its as-is condition and has made such investigation of the facts pertaining to this Access Agreement and all the matters pertaining thereto as State deems necessary.
- **25. Entire Agreement:** The parties further declare and represent that no inducement, promise or agreement not herein expressed has been made to them and this Access Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties, and that the terms of this agreement are contractual and not a mere recital.
- 26. Warranty of Authority: The undersigned each hereby represents that he or she has the authority to, and by signing this Access Agreement does, bind the person or entity on whose behalf and for whom they are signing this Access Agreement and the attendant documents provided for herein, and this Access Agreement and said additional documents are, accordingly, binding on and enforceable against said person or entity.
- 27. Assignment: This Access Agreement shall not, nor shall any interest herein, be assigned, mortgaged, hypothecated, or transferred by State acting by and through its Department of Fish & Wildlife, whether voluntary or involuntary or by operation of law, nor shall State let or sublet or grant any license of permit with respect to the use and occupancy of the Property or any portion thereof, without the prior written consent of District.
- **28. Choice of Law:** This Access Agreement will be governed and construed by the laws of the State of California.
